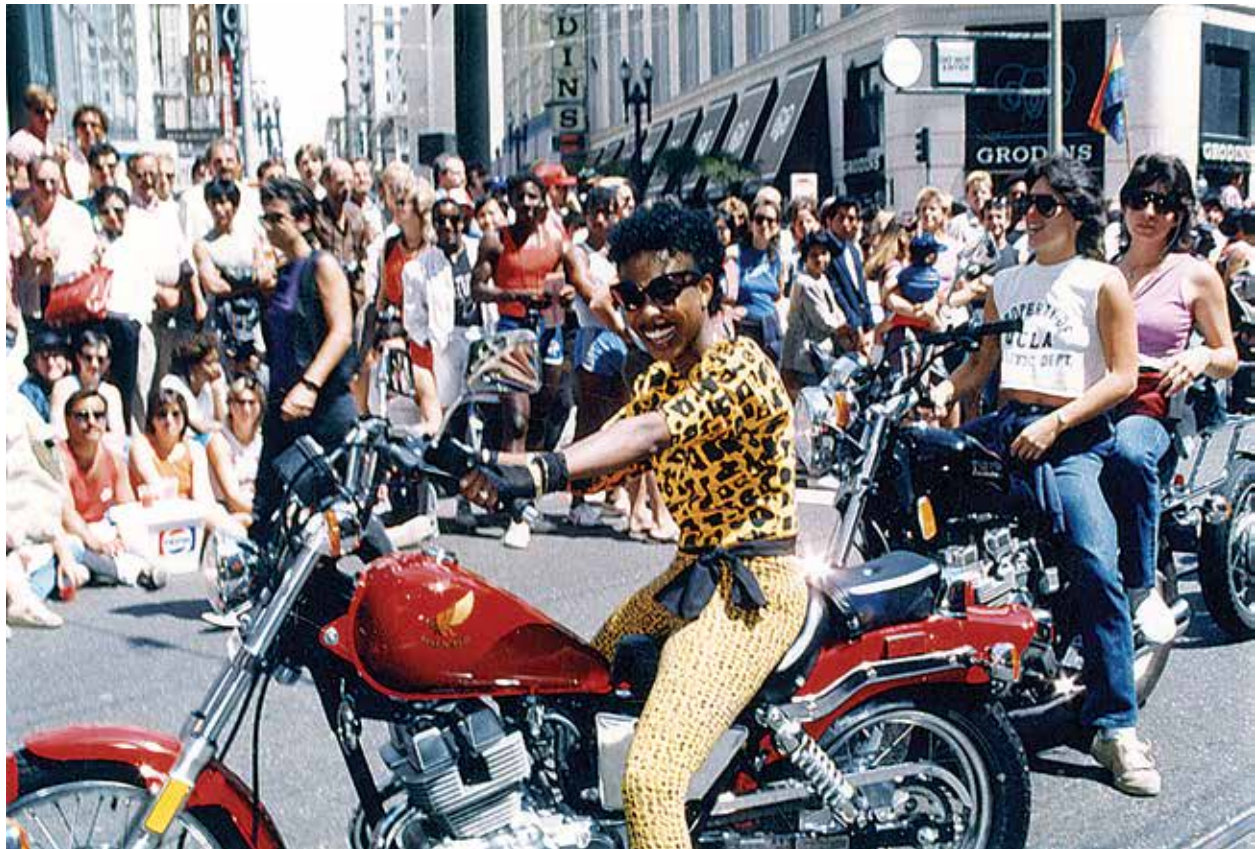
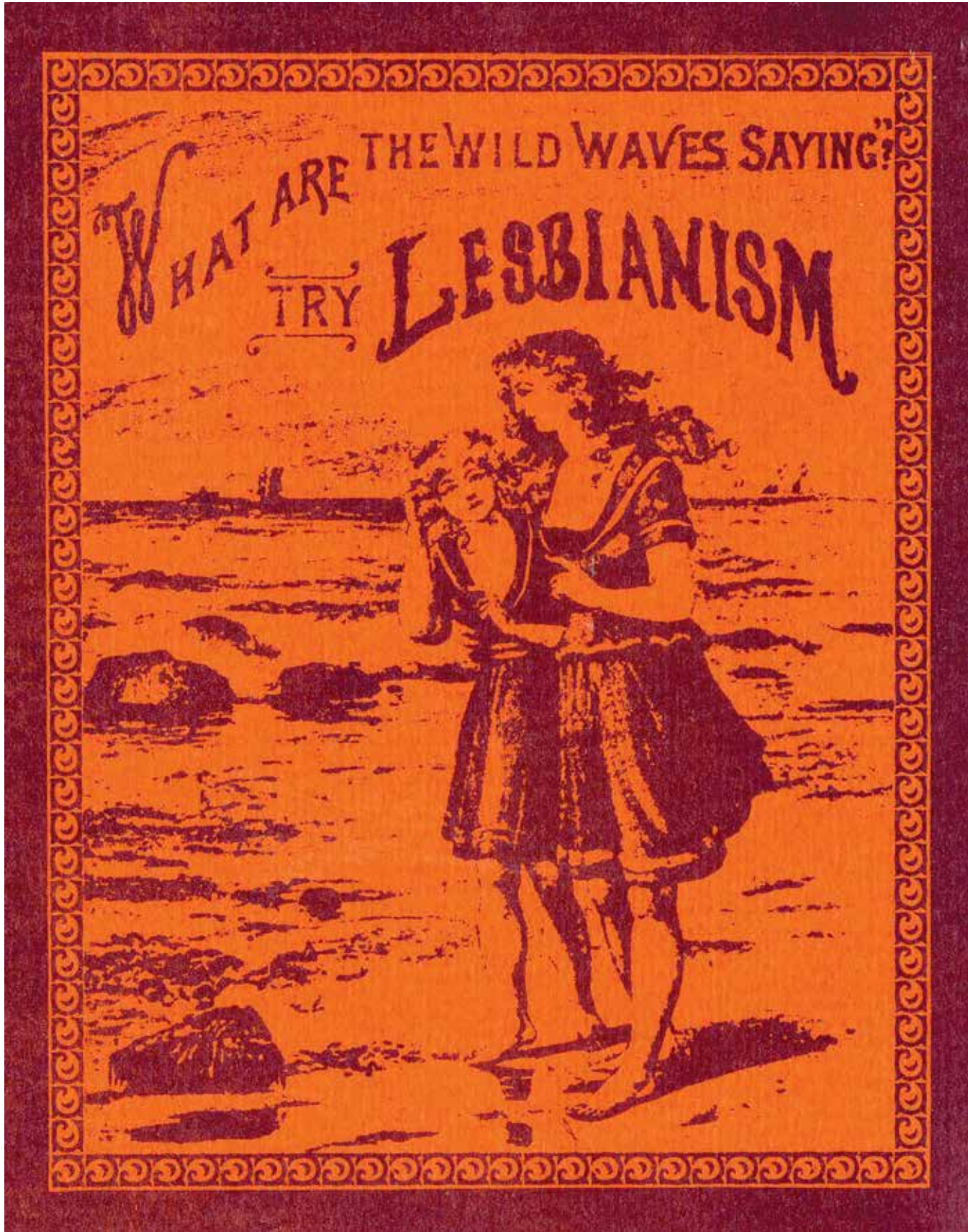




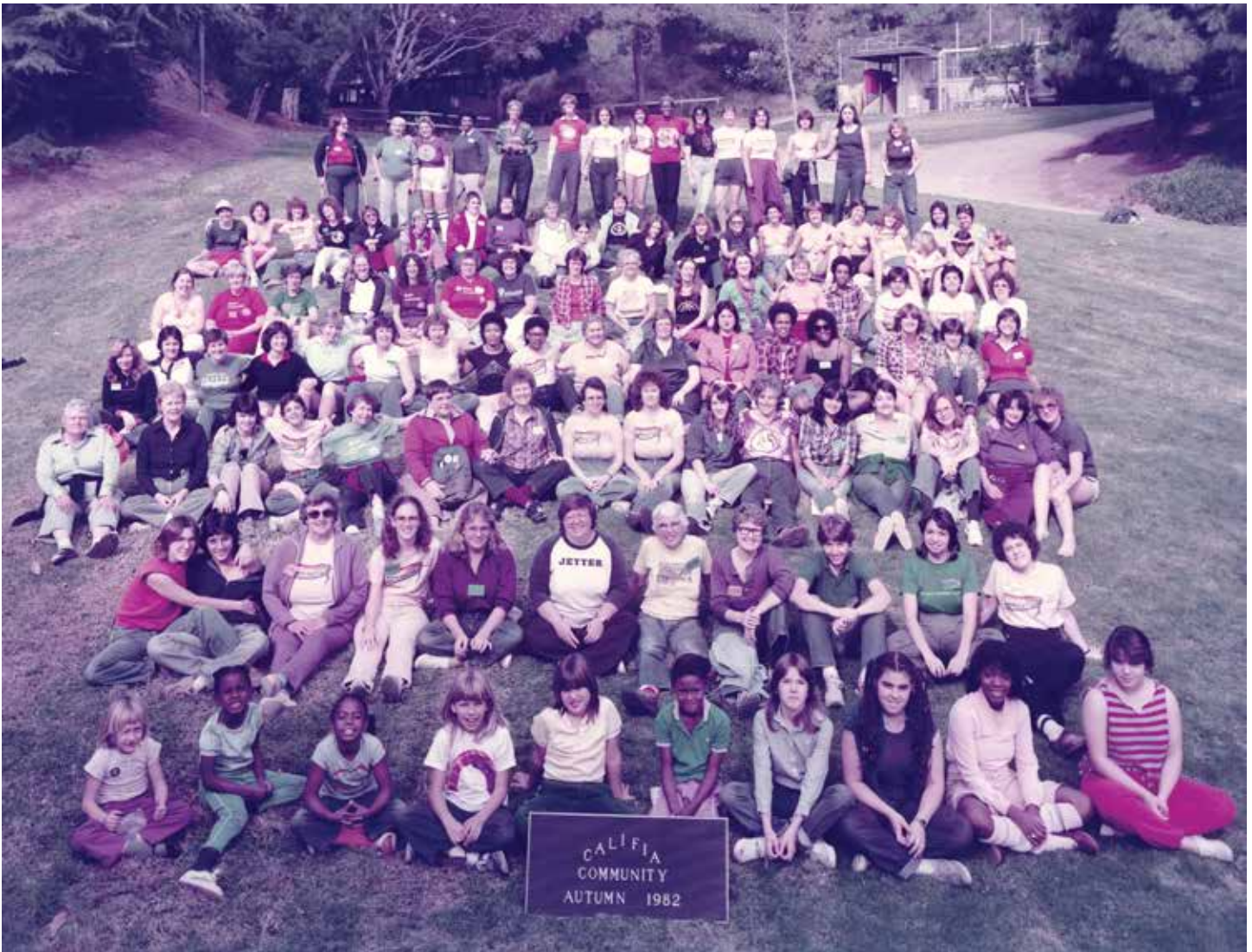

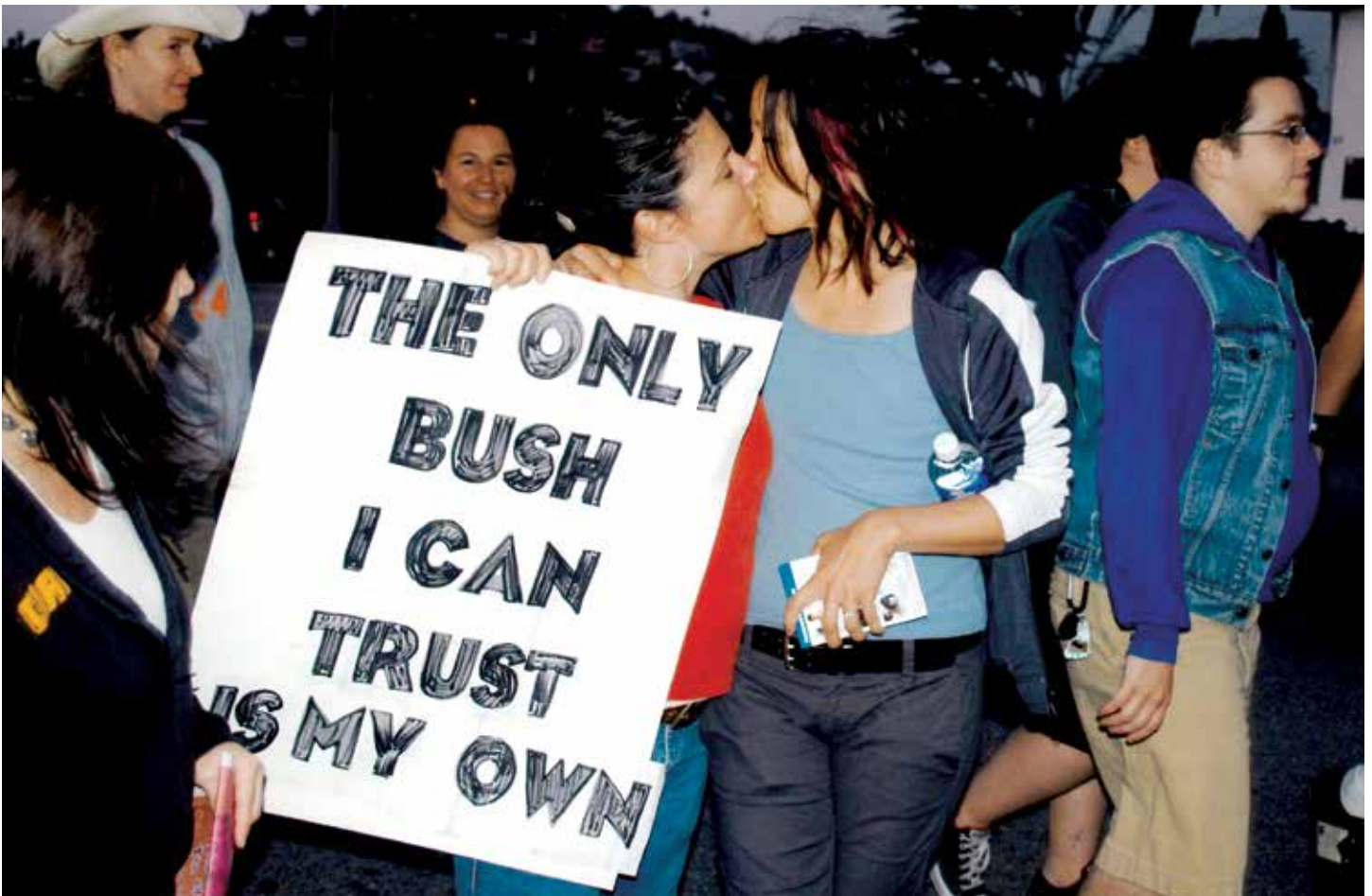

MURAL TO RAISE FUNDS FOR PEOPLE WITH AIDS
"Blue Moon Trilogy," a 160 foot long, 20 foot high mural, will be painted at the DeWitt Street entrance near the Hollywood Blvd. in Hollywood to raise funds for AIDS Project Los Angeles (APLA).
Symbolizing the human transformation that will take place as a result of the AIDS crisis, "Blue Moon Trilogy" will bring AIDS Project Los Angeles' fund-raising program which provide assistance to people who have AIDS and AIDS-related illnesses.
